## 10th anniversary for German teacher scheme

A scheme which allows student teachers in Germany to work in Pembrokeshire classrooms as part of their degree course, has celebrated its 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary.

Since 2004, the PrimA project has seen over 140 Germans in their mid-twenties teach in the county's primary and secondary schools, giving them first-hand experience of working in a truly bilingual setting.

On return to their homeland after a four- month placement, they often become eloquent ambassadors for Wales - some of them even having learnt a little Welsh.



Schools from all over Wales take part in the scheme with Wuppertal University near Dusseldorf - 20 of them in Pembrokeshire.

Professor Baerbel Diehr from the University said that from the start the County Council had led the way and generously supported the project.
